


Welcome to the October 2024 Edition of the CSCNL Newsletter!

Funding Opportunities

Apply for a Wellness Coalition Grant - Wellness Coalition - Avalon East - Providing wellness related funding. Please read the guidelines before completing your application.

Newfoundland and Labrador Community Housing Growth Fund - Up to \$50,000 to help cover the costs of pre-development activities related to the construction of new affordable housing (including business plans, preliminary studies, construction permits,

preliminary analyses and risk assessments, professional services, etc.). Applications open until fund is committed.

Choices for Youth / NL Health Services Integrated Youth Services Call for Proposals A Request for Proposals for community agencies, with the goal of establishing two new Integrated Youth Services (IYS) hubs in regions across the province. Our vision remains to build towards nine regional IYS hubs across NL, starting with two additional hubs. Deadline November 15.

MUN - Funding and Awards for Public Engagement - Memorial University's Office of Public Engagement offers funding and awards programs to further the goals and objectives of the Public Engagement Framework

Community Violence Prevention Grants Program - The Honourable Pam Parsons, Minister Responsible for Women and Gender Equality, announced a call for proposals for a new Community Violence Prevention Grants Program that will see \$525,000 distributed to groups and organizations throughout the province in 2024-25.

International Grenfell Association (IGA) Grant Application Process 2025 - The IGA now uses an online grant application system for organizations interested in applying for a grant. Community based organizations and schools must apply by November 1, 2024 while Labrador-Grenfell Zone has until December 1, 2024 to apply.
